✓	Week 21	Scriptures	Notes
	Sun (5/25)	I Cor. 15:5; John 21:1-25	A week later, with Thomas present, Jesus appears to them again. Again He appears to some of the apostles, this time at the Sea of Tiberias (Galilee)
	Mon	Matthew 28:16,17; I Cor. 15:6	An appointed appearance takes place on a mountain in Galilee.
	Tue	Matthew 28:18-20; Mk 16:15-18; Luke 24:46,47	Now the Lord Jesus Christ gives the Great Commission to the apostles.
	Wed	I Cor. 15:7; Lk 24:44-49	Here He appears to James and all the apostles.
	Thur	Acts 1:3-8; Mk 16:19,20; Lk 24:50-53; Acts 1:9-12	These verses tell of His ascension to receive a kingdom (Daniel 7:13,14) while “they stood gazing.”
	Fri	Acts 1:1-2:47	A few of these verses in Acts 1 were read earlier, but there is such a major transition here that it is a good idea to read them again. Note the plan for evangelizing the world in verse 8. Chapter 2 is the record of the establishment of the church of Christ in the year AD 30. It is one of the most significant events in all of history, as predicted repeatedly by the prophets (Isaiah 2:2-4; Daniel 2; Joel 2; Psalm 2). Be sure to note how people responded to the gospel in the rest of Acts.
	Sat	Acts 3:1-4:31	Using the same method often used by Jesus, Peter & John heal a man and use the opportunity to preach the gospel in ch. 3. As a result of the events in ch. 3, the first of many persecutions occurs—but faith and boldness in Christ does not discourage them in the least.

	Sun (6/1)	Acts 4:32-5:11	We are introduced to Barnabas. Ananias and Sapphira try to deceive God and the church.
	Mon	Acts 5:12-42	Great signs and wonders are done by the Apostles. The Apostles are put on trial again.
	Tue	Acts 6:1-7	The church handles it's first inward problem
	Wed	Acts 8:8-8:3	Stephen becomes the first Christian martyr. Persecution by the Jews begins in earnest.
	Thur	Acts 8:4-40	In spite of persecution the church grows. The gospel goes into Samaria. Note: Those baptized by Philip received forgiveness of sins but not the miraculous gifts of the Spirit. Philip was not an apostle and though he possessed such gifts, he could not impart them to others. Therefore he had to send for Apostles. Once the Apostles died, the ability to impart miraculous gifts died with them.
	Fri	Acts 9:1-25	The same Saul who worked so hard to persecute the disciples now yields his life to Christ (his conversion is also discussed in two of his own lessons in chapters 22 and 26).
	Sat	Galatians 1:17-19	Paul mentions an early trip to Jerusalem.
