

What is the KNOW YOUR BIBLE program?

Our plea has been (and always will be) to go "Back to the Bible." We believe the Bible is key to the salvation of mankind and living a successful Christian life. Therefore, we are issuing a few challenges to help our members get better acquainted with the Word of God (i.e. Know Your Bible).

It has been said, it takes about three months to form a new habit, so for the next few months we challenge our members to READ, PRAISE, MEMORIZE, and SERVE.

1 - READ...

Challenge yourself to read your Bible each day

- * This is a great way to BEGIN each day
- * We have provided a Bible reading schedule, which if followed will take you through the entire New Testament by October's end.
- * Read one to two chapters per day.
- * It only takes about 10-15 minutes per day.

2 - PRAISE...

Challenge to set aside time for daily devotions.

This is a wonderful way for families, couples, and singles alike to END each day

- * We have provided a schedule of devotional ideas and thoughts that compliment the daily reading (p. 4-7)
- * Just 10-15 minutes is all you need.

3 - MEMORIZE...

Challenge yourself to memorize scripture, or at least be familiar with the content and where to find it. There is a list provided on page 2 as well as weekly suggestions in your devotional plan.

4 - **SERVE...**

Challenge yourself to do more! Pick at least one service project for you or your family to do each week. We have provided a list of ideas to get you started (look on page 3)

Dig in and create some new habits that will change your life!

Hide it in Your Heart



Jeremiah 15:16 Matthew 4:4

The importance of memorizing scripture is seen in Psalm 119:11. David said, "Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee." The ability to recall verses and to remember where they are found is vital to any Bible study. We have selected a number of well-known and essential scriptures for your consideration.

Hints for Memorization

- Repetition, repetition, repetition!
- You may want to make flash cards.
- Take a phrase like, "Love suffers long and is kind." Repeat it again and again emphasizing different words each time. Then move to the next phrase. Do this with each phrase until you can say the whole verse without looking.

"LOVE suffers long and is kind"

- "Love SUFFERS long and is kind"
- "Love suffers LONG and is kind"
- "Love suffers long AND is kind"
- "Love suffers long and IS kind"
- "Love suffers long and is KIND"
- When teaching children it may also help make a game of it. Repeat the verse fast, then slow, then loud, then soft, then in a squeaky voice, etc.
- Use your down time to go over your verses (in car, lunch break, before family sits down to meals.)

- Help Someone with their yard work.
- Pick up trash in your community (or around church)
- Wash someone else's car.
- Collect food, clothes, or school supplies to give to others.
- Complain less and compliment more.
- Make a "random acts of kindness" list.
- Cook a meal for someone.
- Pick a deserving couple and babysit for them, giving them a night off.

Memory Verses: Matthew 6:33 Resist the Devil (Matthew 4:1-11; James 4:7) What was key in resisting satan? He misuses scripture (v. 6) therefore we must not. Tuesday Matthew 6:9-13 _____ Thursday How to Pray (Matthew 6:9-13) Proper Direction (9, Our Father), Reverence (9, Hallowed = Holy), Emphasis (10, Thy Kingdom), Concern (10, Matthew 7:13-14 Your Will), Needs (11, Daily Bread), Humility (12, Forgive us), Help (13a, Deliver us from Temptation), Praise (13b). Matthew 7:7 Friday Building on the Rock (Matthew 7:24-29) What is the rock Jesus is describing? How can His words build us up and make us strong? Matthew 16:13-16 Vain Traditions (Mt 15:1-20) It is good to wash hands, it was not sinful. We must never put our opinions, or traditions above the Word. Friday Who is Jesus? (Matthew 16:13-20) The rock upon which Jesus builds his church is the Faith that he is the Son of God. (1 Cor 3:11). Saturday On Sundays and Wednesdays review lessons from that day May 13th-19th Married For Life (Mat 19:1-6) Jesus answer goes back to God's plan from the Beginning (1 man + 1 woman for life). Discuss commitment Memory Verses: Tuesday True Greatness (Matthew 20:20-28) Jesus came to serve (v. 28). We are to follow in his steps. How can we serve others? Matthew 20:28 Greatest Commands (Matthew 22:34-40) Why are these the greatest? Heart = Emotion, Soul = Devotion, Strength = Motion, Mind = Notion Thursday Matthew 22:37-38 Pretending (Matthew 23:27-28) We may fool others but God knows when we are wearing a mask. Be sincere in all you do. Friday Wise Servants (Mat 24:45-51) We are merely stewards of God. How will the Lord find us when he comes? Do we anticipate this or fear it? Saturday On Sundays and Wednesdays review lessons from that day May 20th-26th Lord's Supper (Mat 26:14-30) What was Passover to the Jews? (v.17, Exodus 12:1-13) What is the Lord's Supper to Christians? (Acts 20:7). Monday Memory Verses: Soldiers Mock Jesus (Mat 27:27-31) They dressed him up like a king but he really was their King. Later they begin to see (Mt 27:54) Tuesday Matthew 26:26-28 Thursday | Jesus in Capernaum (Mark 1:29-39) Discuss things going on. How did Jesus spend his alone time? Is it important to make time for God? Matthew 28:18-20 Friday Paralytic Healed (Mark 2:3-12) This story teaches us about Jesus' power and authority. It also shows the faith of 4 men who didn't give up. Family of Jesus (Mk 3:31-35) If we do God's will we become part of His family (Mt 7:21). Like physical families we are born into it (Jn 3:3-5) Saturday On Sundays and Wednesdays review lessons from that day May 27th-June 2 Legion (Mark 5:1-20) This man had no home, no healing, no hope. Jesus gave him back his life! What did the man want to do? (v. 18) Memory Verses: Monday Tuesday John Beheaded (Mark 6:14-29) Note that Herod was sorry (v. 26). He spoke hastily and carelessly. Be careful what promise you make. Mark 7:7 Mark 8:34, 36-37 Total Commitment (Mark 8:34-38) Knowing that the cross is an instrument of death, what is Jesus teaching us about serving him? Thursday Mark 10:27 Friday Transfiguration (Mark 9:1-10) We see a glimpse of Jesus' true glory. Moses represents the Law, Elijah the Prophets. But we obey Jesus! Don't Trust in Riches (Mark 10:23-31) We are all rich by world's standards. Riches are not evil. But they can distract us. How? Saturday

luno 3-0	On Sundays and Wednesdays review lessons from that day	
June 3-9	Monday	Render to Caesar (Mk 12:13-17) Note how cunning they were trying to be, and how easily and simply Jesus answers. The people marveled.
Memory Verses: Mark 16:15-16 Mark 13:32	Tuesday	Parable of Fig Tree (Mark 13:28-31) Many misunderstand this entire chapter. Jesus is discussing the destruction of the temple (see vs. 1-2). He talks of signs which warn the disciples (vs 14-27). And vs. 28-31 indicate when. Then in v. 32 he begins a new topic, the end of the world (notice the words "But of that day". When he comes there will be no signs, no one knows the day! So prepare today!).
Luke 1:37 Luke 2:52	Thursday	Great Commission (Mark 16:15-16) Someone said, "Go Ye means Go ME". If Christians do not spread the good news, who will?
	Friday Saturday	Mary (Luke 1:26-38) Notice her faith. Once she understood what was asked of her, she doesn't make excuse (unlike Moses and others.) They Lost Jesus (Luke 2:41-50) Jesus didn't run off to play & get into mischief. They found him in the temple. Are we about God's business?
June 10-16	On Sunday	s and Wednesdays review lessons from that day
Memory Verses:	Monday	Jesus Rejected (Luke 4:16-30) Under the old law, Jews would worship in the synagogue on Saturdays. No matter where Jesus was, the Bible says this was "his custom" or practice. Under new law where do you think Jesus would be on Sundays? Where should we be?
Hebrews 10:24-25 Matthew 4:19	Tuesday	Fishers of Men (Luke 5:1-11) Verse 5 indicates that Peter was reluctant ("nevertheless"). However he obeyed and was greatly rewarded. God's way is always the right way and the best way. Let us launch out into deeper faith and commitment to Him.
	Thursday	Woman Forgiven (Lk 7:36-50) God is the only one able to forgive sin, so what was Jesus claiming? What does the parable teach (vs. 41-42)?
	Friday Saturday	Parable of Soils (Lk 8:4-15) Seed = Word (v.11). Soil = hearts of men (v. 12). Let us always prepare our hearts (Keep out weeds. Water. Etc) Don't Make Excuses (Lk 9:57-62) Jesus wants dedication not lip service. Action not words. In verse 59, most believe the man's father was not actually dead. So he was actually saying, "Jesus, I will follow you later". He was making an excuse.
June 17-23	On Sunday	s and Wednesdays review lessons from that day
Memory Verses: Luke 13:3,5	Monday Tuesday	Ask, Seek, Knock (Luke 11:5-13) God knows what we need, but still wants us to ask. Prayer is an act of Faith. (Key to this discussion is v. 13) Rich Fool (Luke 12:13-21) Why was this man foolish? He forgot: 1. God gave it all 2. The needs of others 3. Life isn't about stuff.
Luke 15:7	Thursday	Great Supper (Lk 14:15-24) God doesn't exclude or look down on anyone. Neither should we. All are invited to partake of same blessings.
	Friday	Lost Son (Lk 15:11-32) Why did Jesus tell this parable? (vs. 1-3) Sin promises much, offers little. God is always waiting for lost to come home.
June 24-30		Rich man & Lazarus (Lk 16:19-31) What was important to the Rich man in life (v. 19)? What was important to him in Torments (v. 24,27-28)? s and Wednesdays review lessons from that day
Memory Verses:	Monday	Parable on Prayer (Luke 18:9-14) Compare these two prayers. Notice the attitude, posture, petition. Which pleased God?
Luke 22:42	Tuesday	Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-10) He sought to see Jesus (are we?). He allowed Jesus into his home (have we?). He had a penitent attitude (do we?)
Luke 23:34	Thursday	The Widow's Mites (Luke 21:1-4) Here is an example of giving 100%. Does God care about the amount we give or the attitude behind it?
Luke 24:46-47	Friday	Gethsemane (Luke 22:39-51) Here we witness His humanity. We see His agony. But once he rose from prayer he never looked back.
	Saturday	The Crucified King (Lk 23:26-34) Think about how they treated him. Think of what crucifixion was. Now think of the statement in verse 34.

July 1-7		s and Wednesdays review lessons from that day
Memory Verses:	Monday Tuesday	The Word (John 1:1-14) John tells us of Jesus' pre-existence ("in beginning"), His Deity ("was God"), His Power ("made through Him") Water to Wine (John 2:1-12) "Whatever He says to you, do it", that is a statement to live by! Notice what happened when they obeyed.
John 1:1-5	Thursday	White Harvest (Jn 4:27-42) As people came up from town to see him, Jesus urged the disciples to look and see. We too need around us!
John 3:16	Friday	Healing at the Pool (Jn 5:5-15) After being healed the man was found "in the temple" (v.14). Do we praise God for our many blessings?
John 4:23-24	Saturday	Feeding the 5000 (John 6:1-14) God multiplies the little we give Him. Serve him in what ways you can, He will give the increase.
July 8-14		s and Wednesdays review lessons from that day
Memory Verses:	Monday	Adulterous Woman (Jn 8:1-11) Jesus didn't overlook this woman's sin or the seriousness of it (v. 10). He merely uses this situation to remind the self-righteous Pharisees that we are all sinners and therefore are all in need of mercy. (Note how they left in verse 9).
John 8:23-24	Tuesday	Now I See (Jn 9:1-12, 26-38) This man's eyes were opened to many things. He saw clearly what others willfully ignored (emphasize v. 25)
John 8:31-32 John 11:25, 35	Thursday	Lazarus (John 11:17-44) This miracle was another which couldn't be denied (note Jn 12:9-10). He had been dead 4 days. This was evidenced by the stench (11:39). Jesus cares about our Pain (11:33-35). He has power over death (11:43-44). Truly He is the Resurrection and the Life.
	Friday	Triumphant Entry (Jn 12:12-19) He entered Jerusalem like a conquering hero, but how did he leave? Beware following the fickle crowd.
	Saturday	Upper Room (John 13:1-17) Washing feet was job of the lowest servant. No apostle volunteered. So Jesus served. He taught by doing.
July 15-21	On Sunday	s and Wednesdays review lessons from that day
Memory Verses:	Monday	Love (Jn 15:9-17) If I want to abide in Christ then I must obey. If I want His joy, then I must love. To love I follow his example not the world's
John 14:6 John 14:15	Tuesday	Sorrow to Joy (Jn 16:16-22) Jesus prepared his disciples for the coming time of sorrow (i.e. His death). He reassured them that it would not last forever. Times of sorrow come to all, but by continuing to trust in God and His word, sorrow can be turned into Joy.
John 15:5, 12	Thursday Friday	Peter's Denial (John 18:15-27) Peter was afraid. Do we have the courage to let people know we are Christians even when its not popular? "It is Finished" (John 19:28-37) He did not think about his own needs until all was accomplished. When life gets tough many give up, yet
	Saturday	Jesus teaches us to finish the race. True blessing is not found in beginning a race, but in finishing it (Rev 2:10). Thomas Believes (Jn 20:24-31) Why did John write this book? (vs. 30-31). Jesus speaks of us in vs. 29. May we respond like Thomas (v. 28)
July 22 28		s and Wednesdays review lessons from that day
July 22-28	Monday	Pentecost (Acts 2:36-42) The church begins. People become Christians for 1st time. How? Through Belief (37) Repentance & Baptism (38)
Memory Verses:	Tuesday	Lame Man Healed (Acts 3:1-13) This man was looking for money & got so much more. The most important thing we can give is Jesus.
Acts 2:37-38 Acts 2:40	Thursday	First Martyr (Acts 7:54-60) Steven was a good man. This is seen in how he faced death. Notice how Christ-like he was as he faced death.
Acts 2:47	Friday	The Ethiopian (Acts 8:26-39) What an example! He had gone far to worship (over 1000 miles). He didn't leave his religion at the temple (still studying). He read the right book (the Bible). He was eager to believe and be baptized (vs. 35-38). He had joy for he had found Jesus.
	Saturday	Dorcas (Acts 9:36-43) To us she has a funny name, but she was a beautiful servant. Notice her care for the widows of the church (v. 39).
July 29-Aug 4	On Sunday	s and Wednesdays review lessons from that day
Memory Verses:	Monday	First Gentile Convert (Acts 11:1-18) Before this the Gospel was limited to the Jews only. God wants all people to be Christians (see 11:26)
Acts 11:26	Tuesday	Paul in Cyprus (Acts 13:4-12) His first recorded miracle, but note what astonished the proconsul (v. 12 the message more than the miracle!)
Acts 17:11 Acts 17:30	Thursday	Division over Mark (Acts 15:36-41) Mark went home on pervious trip (13:13) Paul wasn't happy. Barnabas wanted to give him a 2nd chance. Barnabas didn't give up on him, and later he went on to become helpful to Paul (2 Tim 4:11) and then to write the Gospel of Mark.
	Friday	Jailer Converted (Acts 16:25-35) If they're praising God at midnight. What time was it when Jailer was baptized? Speaks of its importance!
	Saturday	Noble Bereans (Acts 17:10-12) Why do they receive the praise of scripture? How would we be described by our Bible study habits?

August 5-11	On Sunday	rs and Wednesdays review lessons from that day
Memory Verses:	Monday	Riot in Ephesus (Acts 19:23-41) The gospel was having such an effect it was impacting trade in the city! Christianity should cause change.
Acts 20:7 Acts 22:16	Tuesday	Paul in Troas (Acts 20:7-12) Illustrates the dangers of falling asleep during the sermon! On what day did these Christians worship?
	Thursday	Paul's Conversion (Acts 22:1-16) As he recounts his conversion, note what Paul said he did in order to have his sins washed away. Also notice Jesus words in verse 7. In persecuting Christians Paul was persecuting Christ. Christ feels and knows our pain and sorrows!
Romans 1:16	Friday	Plot against Paul (Acts 23:11-22) "The Lord stood by Him". Although we may not see Him as Paul did. He will never forsake us (Heb 13:5)
	Saturday	Almost Persuaded (Acts 26:24-29) "truth and reason" still gets through to people. They react in different ways (v. 24, 28). Keep preaching
August 12-18		rs and Wednesdays review lessons from that day
Memory Verses:	Monday Tuesday	God Revealed (Rom 1:18-22) Paul states that looking at nature reveals much about God: 1. That He exists 2. That He is Powerful (Psalm 19:1 Guilty! (Rom 3:9-12, 23-26) Paul's argument in the book is Ch 1 = Gentiles have sinned, Ch 2 = Jews have sinned, Ch 3 = All have sinned. Since
Romans 3:23	Tuesday	all are guilty, all are deserving of death, but there is hope in Jesus Christ! (Rom 6:23).
Romans 6:23 Romans 10:17	Thursday	Buried in Baptism (Rom 6:3-23) Baptism reenacts the Gospel (die, buried, are raised). Baptism is essential because it puts one "into Christ"
,	Friday	Free from the Old Law (Rom 7:1-6) We no longer have to practice the Law of Moses we are under the Law of Christ. His death feed us.
A	Saturday	Undying Love (Rom 8:35-39) No matter what, God loves you! Nothing will ever change this. Even when we sin He still loves us (Rom 5:8).
August 19-25	Monday	s and Wednesdays review lessons from that day Wanted Dead and Alive (Rom 12:1-2) Seems like a contradiction, but we only begin to live once we die (Die to self that is). Understanding
Memory Verses:	Monday	that he died that we might live, we place ourselves into His service. Conforming our lives to into His.
Romans 12:1-2 Romans 16:16	Tuesday	Christ-Like (Rom 13:8-14) Verse 14 says "put on Christ", meaning act like Jesus. Respect authority (1-7) Love. Do no harm. Do not sin (13).
	Thursday	Churches of Christ (Rom 16:16-20) The church belongs to Christ (v. 16). It's doctrine or teaching should be His doctrine (v. 17).
