# Magnificent Mercy

## Intro:

- A. Text: Luke 6:35-36
- B. Mercy is closely related to G\_\_\_\_\_ but not the same (1 Tim 1:2, 2 Tim 1:2, Titus 1:4, 2 Jn 1:3, Heb 4:16).
  - 1. Grace = \_\_\_\_\_
  - 2. Mercy = \_\_\_\_\_

## I. Magnificent Mercy

- A. In English the word means “Pain of H\_\_\_\_\_”. The words translated Mercy in Hebrew refer to:
  - 1. A feeling of W\_\_\_\_\_ toward another.
  - 2. To B\_\_\_\_\_ the neck.
- B. In Greek the word refers to the demonstration of pity or sympathy. Vine says it is “to be actively C\_\_\_\_\_”
- C. The Scriptures praise God’s merciful kindness (Ps 103, Lamentations 3:21-24, 2 Corinthians 1:3, Eph 2:4)

## II. Mercy M\_\_\_\_\_

- A. We are to be merciful because G\_\_\_\_\_ is merciful (Philippians 1:20, Ephesians 5:1, Matthew 23:23).
  - 1. This is emphasized in the Jesus’ P\_\_\_\_\_
  - 2. Luke 10:25-37 - The G\_\_\_\_\_ S\_\_\_\_\_
  - 3. Who needs our mercy?
- B. We are to be merciful because we have R\_\_\_\_\_ mercy.
  - 1. One of the greatest examples of this is found in Mat.18:21-35 - The U\_\_\_\_\_ Servant
  - 2. James 2:13 - “J\_\_\_\_\_ is without mercy to those who show no mercy”
  - 3. We must remember we are debtors!
